Join us as we see photos, hear audio and video clips from the story of the recording industry from 1877 to about 1964 when Bob Dylan recorded "The Times They Are A Changin'." Music Producer, educator and author **John Boylan** will provide the first half of his presentation, "The Recording Industry, From Edison to Spotify" at the Los Angeles Film School's Main Theater. The presentation was designed for John's classes at UCLA and Citrus College and will doubtless eventually become a bound paper volume about technology, culture and music.


Currently celebrating over fifty years in the music industry, John Boylan is one of the most successful record producers in contemporary music. He has produced over fifty albums which have sold more than forty million records, garnering a Grammy and three nominations. His work crosses all boundaries of music, from rock to country and from children's music to film soundtracks.

From his roots in theatre arts at Bard College to a fire in Greenwich

Village (destroyed musical instruments) to Tin Pan Alley and on to Los Angeles, John's life as a performer, writer and producer has allowed him to play a meaningful role in the careers of many chart busting acts. His discography is impressive, starting in 1967:

Please use the directions below for parking and building entrance instructions.

From Sunset Blvd., turn North onto Ivar—the street immediately West of the school. You will see Amoeba Records and Iack in the Box at this intersection.

From Ivar, take the third right up a ramp into the uncovered parking lot. This lot is at the South/East corner of Selma and Ivar. You will need to take a ticket (we will validate it for you).

Once you've parked, head toward the body of the building where you will find double glass doors. To the right of the doors is an intercom. Read instructions to dial reception and let them know who you are here to see. They will unlock the doors. Once inside, take the elevator to the Lobby (L) and let the receptionists know again who you are here to see.
